Elizabeth Sweet was born with a heart defect called patent ductus arteriosus (PDA) on May 29, 2019. Then, 15 months later, her parents Robert and Megan Sweet, said doctors discovered something was wrong with her.

Doctors confirmed that she had a heart murmur and a hole in her heart. They determined that she needed to have surgery to go in and fix her mitral valve. Megan said it was hard to hear that they want to cut your child open to fix their heart.

All this was in August 2022 and this is the only surgery Elizabeth has had. She is hopeful and stable now, however she needs her meds every night before bed.

Elizabeth, now five years old, shared she wants to be a voice for her peers and raise awareness to children born with heart defects.


DON'T FORGET—Daylight Savings Time Change is coming right up—March 9th! Please remember to set your clocks forward one hour the night before!
